

TOWN OF ROSENDALE
TOWN BOARD MEETING
JUNE 8, 2016

Supervisor Walsh called the meeting to order at 7:07 pm at the Rondout Municipal Building with the Pledge to the Flag.

Supervisor Walsh made a motion to accept all minutes from May, 2nd by Councilwoman Metzger. ROLL VOTE: 5 YES.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Councilman Pryslopski reviewed all books for Judge Pape and Judge Hornbeck and all reconcile. The Town Court received a JCAP grant and so far were able to purchase a security door for the inmates, walk through metal detector and office supplies. They still have some money left and are deciding what to plan next. The Transfer Station took in \$1,722.02 after pull fees and \$1,493.00 in bottle returns to date. The Environmental Commission have a lot of projects they are working on. They are having a Creek Week event in September and also finished the survey and comments on Pilgrim Pipeline. The cameras and air conditioning are being installed at the Rondout Municipal Building over the next few weeks. Councilwoman Lipari reported the Town Clerk's Office took in \$7,047.25 and has been very busy. The Food Pantry has increasing numbers; they have also decided to hold their meeting every other month at the Recreation Center. The Highway Department took in \$100.00 and finished paving Circle Avenue. High Falls Water discussed having a rate increase for the water. There were 2 use variances and area variances for ZBA and also took in \$60.00. Councilman Hughes said the Water and Sewer Department took in \$22,768.73 and is waiting for final approvals from the Department of Health to start the water main project. They are planning to start it the project in July. The Planning Board took in \$1,109.18 and their previous meeting was discussed. The Rosendale Pool is moving along well with the Bathhouse being delayed they discussed the options they will have for restrooms and hand washing stations around the pool.

The Bookkeepers office is overloaded, but has been running smooth. The employees are being switched over to a new time keeping system which should help the office. Councilman Metzger reported the Youth Department taking in \$4,385.00, Assessors took in \$3.00, Recreation Department \$4,052.36 and Police Department \$20.00. The Dog Kennels passed their annual inspection from Agriculture and Markets and they also increased the Deputy Dog Control's hours. The Deputy is also looking into starting a Facebook page for all their needs and adoption information on the dogs in the kennels. The Youth Department has been working on summer camp enrollments, discussing summer programs, having a summer camp fire and also the Car Show took in \$1,700.00 which will be split with the Lion's Club. The Recreation Commission had a presentation presented by the swim team and was concerned because their enrollment has dropped in half. Councilwoman Metzger made a motion to accept the Recreation Commission's recommendation for \$300.00 a week fee for the Rosendale Rapids for 3 hour practices when the pool opens, 2nd by Supervisor Walsh. ROLL VOTE: 5 YES

2. SITE PLAN REVIEW – Green Garden Café: Yuval Sterer submitted an Even Application to the Town Board hoping for a solution to his ongoing noise issue. The application was denied by the Board and they explained why. Supervisor Walsh said this is not an event problem it's a noise ordinance issue and it needs to be addressed with the Police Department. Yuval said there needs to be a change in the code and have the community work together.

3. SITE PLAN REVIEW – HITS Triathlon: Supervisor Walsh made a motion to approve the event with an additionally insured certificate with the town, Fire Department sign off and also the Highway Department, 2nd by Councilwoman Metzger. ROLL VOTE: 5 YES.

4. RESOLUTION 06-2016-#4 – Supervisor Walsh made a motion that the Town Board of the Town of Rosendale authorizes the Supervisor to sign the agreement with BOCES, 2nd by Councilman Pryslopsi. ROLL VOTE: 5 YES.

5. RESOLUTION 06-2016-#5 – Supervisor Walsh made a motion that the Town Board of the Town of Rosendale authorizes the Supervisor to sign the Change Order for the replacement of the Keator Avenue water main, 2nd by Councilman Hughes. ROLL VOTE: 5 YES.

6. RESOLUTION 06-2016-#6 – Supervisor Walsh made a motion that the Town Board of the Town of Rosendale approves the engineering and environmental reports for the Town of

Rosendale wastewater treatment plant improvement documents, 2nd by Councilman Hughes.
